
In Schuylkill County, there are 2966 preschool children (ages 3-5).

60% live in families with income at or below 300% of the federal poverty level.

19% live in households at or below 100% of the federal poverty guidelines.

Only 32% have access to publicly-funded, high-quality, early education programs.

Our Head Start, PA PreK Counts, and child care sites are located in communities with the greatest need for publicly-funded, high-quality, early education programs: Ashland, Mahanoy City, Pottsville, Saint Clair, Schuylkill Haven, Shenandoah, and Tamaqua.



The Final Child Outcomes Progress Report is based on 179 Head Start and 136 PA Pre-K Counts children who transitioned into kindergarten in the Fall of 2024. 19% of Head Start and 17% of PA Pre-K Counts children who transitioned into kindergarten received early intervention services.

The chart indicates our children's assessed **proficiency**, at the beginning and end of the school year, in the key developmental areas identified for school readiness using the Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP).

FAMILY SURVEY RESULTS

- 98% responded that their child's experience in our program prepared him/her to successfully transition to kindergarten
- 96% responded that they read the books with their child that we provided, *My New School and All About Me*, to prepare for the transition to kindergarten
- 95% responded that their child had no problems separating from them during the first few weeks of kindergarten
- 97% reported that their child made progress toward achieving his/her school readiness goals


