


### The Importance of Quality Preschool Education

90% of a child's brain develops before kindergarten. More than 85% of the foundation for communication, critical thinking, problem-solving, and team work is developed by age 5 - skills that employers cite as critical to success in the workplace.

Children who attend a quality preschool program

- ✓ enter kindergarten more prepared
- ✓ achieve greater success
- ✓ receive less remediation
- ✓ do not need costly early intervention services
- ✓ have fewer grade retentions
- ✓ have higher standardized test scores
- ✓ are more likely to graduate high school
- ✓ less likely to get involved with law enforcement
- ✓ less likely to be incarcerated

In Schuylkill County, there are **2966** preschool children (ages 3-5).

**60%** live in families with income at or below 300% of the federal poverty level.

**19%** live in households at or below 100% of the federal poverty guidelines.

**Only 21%** have access to publicly-funded, high-quality, early education programs.

Our Head Start, PA PreK Counts, and child care sites are located in communities with the greatest need for publicly-funded, high-quality, early education programs: Ashland, Mahanoy City, Pottsville, Saint Clair, Schuylkill Haven, Shenandoah, and Tamaqua.





### FAMILY SURVEY RESULTS

98% responded that their child's experience in our program prepared their child to successfully transition to kindergarten

97% reported that their child made progress toward achieving his/her school readiness goals

The **Final Child Outcomes Progress Report** is based on **172 Head Start** and **140 PA Pre-K Counts** children who transitioned into kindergarten in the Fall of 2025. 23% of **Head Start** and 23% of **PA Pre-K Counts** children who transitioned into kindergarten received early intervention services.

The chart indicates our children's assessed **proficiency**, at the beginning and end of the school year, in the key developmental areas identified for school readiness using the Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP).


